COURSE OVERVIEW

Please note that this program is limited to international medical graduates who are currently practicing as physicians in British Columbia and are on the College of Physicians and Surgeons of BC's Provisional Register.

An Overview of the MCCQE Part II Exam

Evaluation of candidates during the exam is based on expectations of physicians in the Canadian healthcare system. Presentations and demonstrations will cover exam expectations for physician-patient communication, expectations of the physical exam, and data gathering and interpretation.

An Introduction to the Objective Structured Clinical Exam (OSCE) Format

This exam format is used by Canadian medical schools, the Medical Council of Canada (QE Part II), the College of Family Physicians of Canada, and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. In this format, candidates interact with "standardized patients" who are actors trained to realistically portray typical patient presentations while physician examiners observe and grade the candidates' performance. During the course, the marking process and expectations of the candidates will be explained. Candidates will have a chance to practice interacting with typical exam structure involving standardized patients, and will receive individualized feedback from physician examiners as part of the exam preparation course.
